

Guidelines for authors

- **Language:** German or English
- **Length:** Maximum 25 pages (1½ line spacing), approx. 12.000 words
- **Authors'** name(s) to be indicated below the paper title, with an * for a footnote giving title(s), full affiliation(s), full address(es), including e-mail addresses.
- **A Summary** in English, of 1/4 page at most, approx. 200-250 words
- A further English abstract (if full text is in German) or German abstract (if full text is in English) of not more than 200-250 words for the Journal of Economic Literature
- **Figures: original format to be submitted either in a separate file (Word, rtf, jpeg, Excel, and Powerpoint are all acceptable) or embedded in the text.**
- **Alphabetical list of references** (bibliography) at the end with full details.

The presentation must be as follows:

Books: Baumol, William J. and Wallace E. Oates (1988). *The Theory of Environmental Policy*. Cambridge: Cambridge University Press.

Articles: Weitzman, Martin L. (1974). Prices vs. Quantities, *Review of Economic Studies*. 41: 477-499.

Articles from Books: Borchering, Thomas E., Werner W. Pommerehne and Friedrich F. Schneider (1990). Comparing the Efficiency of Private and Public Production, in: Samuel H. Baker and Catherine S. Elliot (eds.), *Readings in Public Sector Economics*. Lexington (Mass.): D.C. Heath and Company: 397-413.

• **Reference in the text:** Downs (1987, 123) states '.....' (single quotation marks).

Formatting

- **Footnote** numbers should follow on throughout the manuscript. Footnotes should be indicated as follows: xxx¹, and enumerated thus: 1. xxx.
- **Headings:** – Main Headings with Roman numerals (I, II, ...) and CAPITALS (not bold)
– Sub-headings with Arabic numerals and in italics (*I., 2., ...*)
- **Expressions foreign to the language** of the article should be in *italics*.
- **Equations** to be numbered on the right-hand side, near the margin, (1), (2), etc.
- Please use as few abbreviations as possible.
- Carefully check all citations.
- Text and summaries should be sent as an unencoded **e-mail attachment** (Word format; figures separately or embedded in the original format).
